Turning the page toward the coming year.

I have heard some folks say that they will be staying awake on New Year's Eve to ensure the arrival of the coming year of 2021; as well as others who will stay awake to ensure that 2020 leaves. The calendar we keep is an invention of man. God is not bound by time nor the passing of the years. Peter reminds us that *"one day with the Lord is as a thousand years and a thousand years as one day."*(2 Peter 3:8)

There is also the occasion that we can look back to and see what adjustments we made to deal with the changes. These are both teachable moments where we can learn more about God and ourselves. Lessons on the importance of relying on God and education in God's wisdom as our Creator instills in us the ability to change and adapt.
